INTRODUCTION

Following an unexpected family tragedy in 2021, horses have come galloping into the KIDS Foundation world. Our CEO and Founder, Susie, tragically lost her granddaughter Bella to Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA). Following the celebration of Bella's short life, the family needed time together and decided to take a holiday, which included a horse ride. It had been more than 35 years since Susie had ridden a horse, however, that experience led horses to the KIDS Foundation.

Horses are very sensitive to emotional and verbal cues and for these reasons, horses now play a major role in KIDS programs. Empowerment, bonding and building trust with the horses has now found a special place in our Education and Recovery programs. These recovery camps have shown to have a positive effect on children overcoming anxiety and PTSD from traumatic events, promoting positive mental health.

We now have an equine-based program linked closely with our books "SeeMore and Carm" and "SeeMore Kindness" is aimed at helping children develop an awareness of emotional understanding and communication. More recently we incorporated aspects of the Equine Assisted Learning Program into Connecting Generations where the mini ponies interact with the children and residents of the aged care centre.

Horses also drive our fundraising. The Tour d'Horse event is not only the highlight of our annual calendar but also an important initiative supporting and funding the Foundation's Recovery and Education programs, now reaching up to 400,000 Australian children annually. It is important that we share with our readers that all of our camps, events, appearance and guest speaking attendances are fully delivered in a voluntary capacity by staff, board members, supporters and ambassadors, ensuring all funds raised go directly to KIDS Foundation programs.

In the 2025 Annual report we share memories from a busy rewarding year and more magical stories, many involving horses. We hope you enjoy reading, stay happy, healthy and safe.

5000 Early Childhood Education Centres received SeeMore Safety program packs.

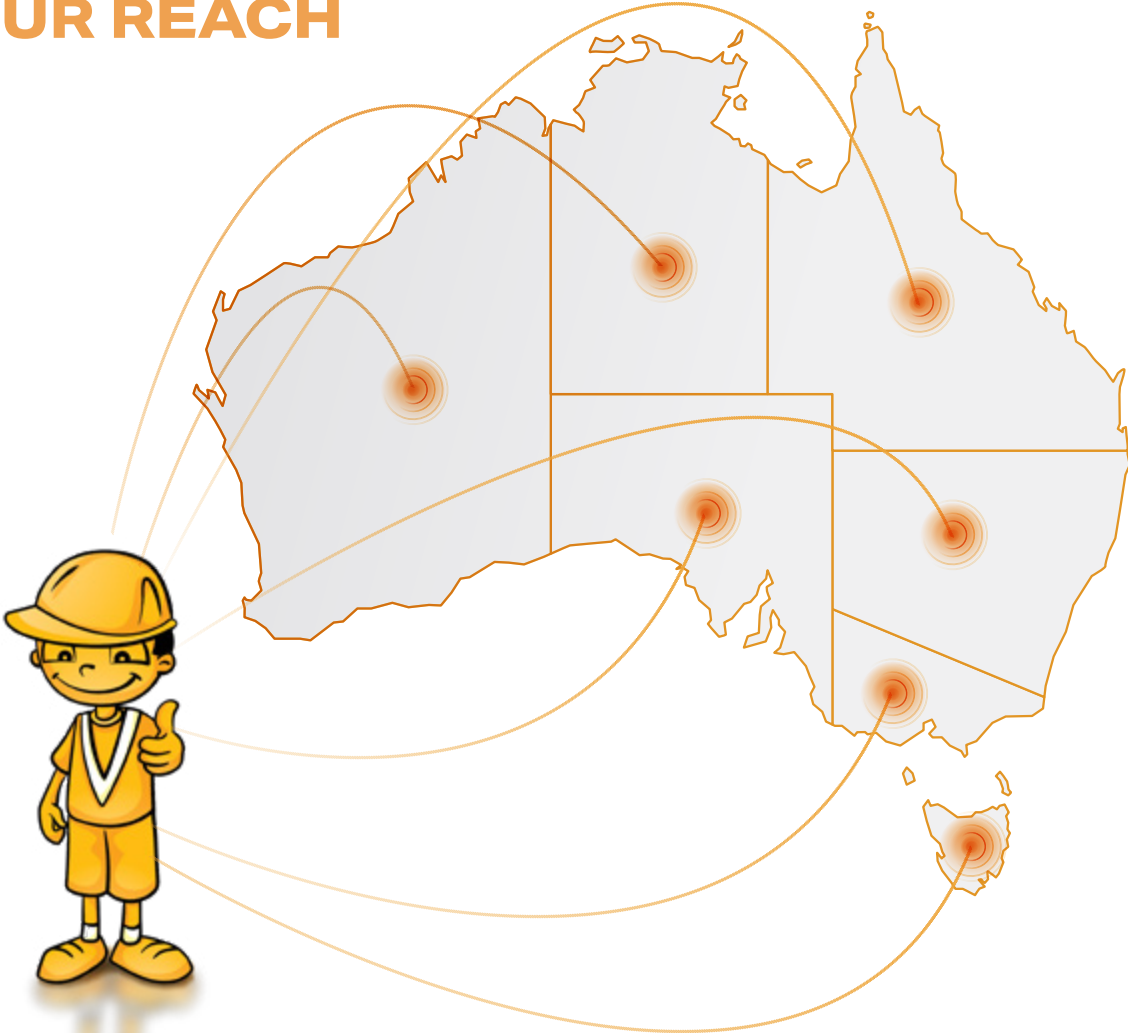


12, 548 support hours were provided through one-on-one time, in group settings and at camps.

OUR PROGRAMS

Recovery

In our Recovery Programs we celebrate all abilities, offering support, camps and recovery programs for children and families following traumatic events that change lives and capabilities.

Education

We educate and empower children to learn about safety and wellbeing, while still allowing them to be kids.

We do this nationally through Early Childhood Education Centres and preschools, using our series of SeeMore Safety programs and activities. These include children's story books, incursions with visits from SeeMore, Connecting Generations – Adopt a GrandBuddy and even Miniature Horses. Our programs help children understand their emotions, physical capabilities and manage risk so they can live healthy, happy and safe lives.

RECOVERY

Thanks to the amazing support of Move 4 Bella, this year our Recovery program expanded from supporting those impacted by life-changing injury, burns and trauma to also supporting individuals and families affected by medical conditions such as SMA. This support had a profound impact on the children and families who attended Camp Phoenix in August 2024.

The positive effect of the horse-human connection continued throughout the year with equine assisted learning and other equine related activities being part of many of our Recovery Camps.

We are proudly delivering projects for the Peer Support and Capacity Building (PSCB) grant for the NDIS. This program aims to increase the skills, knowledge and confidence of people with disability by empowering them to be able to advocate for their rights and connect with support services. It also provides participants with opportunities to develop a social network with others who have similar lived experiences.

Empowering RIGHTS Program

This year, the KIDS Foundation launched Empowering RIGHTS (Resilience, Independence, Goals, Health, Togetherness, and Safety), a program co-created by young people with different abilities to build a social participation network supporting recovery from trauma. Focused on developing life skills, confidence, and independence, the program fosters resilience and positive connections through camps and group activities. Led by Erynne and Mia, Empowering RIGHTS employs and engages differently abled youth and volunteers to promote inclusion. The first sessions included food handling and healthy meal preparation, inspiring some participants to explore careers in hospitality.

EDUCATION

CARHM Start Program

CARHM (**C**onnect**A**ctive **R**esilient **H**ea**M**indful) Start is focused on supporting the social, physical, and emotional wellbeing of children aged 3-4 years. Taking a holistic approach, it aimed to empower children to become Connected, Active, Resilient, Healthy, and Mindful.

A unique feature of the program was the inclusion of visits from gentle, trained miniature horses. These visits supported emotional development and social skills, offering children a rare and enriching experience.

Connecting Generations

Our Connecting Generations program was implemented at Mecwacare in Darley, with children from Journey Early Learning Centre and our mini ponies Carm and Eleven Eleven.

We set up activities that brought both young and old together. The mini ponies were a highlight and moved calmly through the entire centre. Their gentle presence brought joy, comfort, and plenty of smiles.

It was heartwarming to see children and elderly residents connect through shared activities.



Equine Education

Through the KIDS Foundation's equine incursions, children are invited to explore a wide range of emotions and learn strategies to support their own emotional regulation.



Lexus Melbourne Cup Tour

In 2024, the Lexus Melbourne Cup Tour brought the iconic \$750,000 trophy to Iris Ramsay Kindergarten in Ballarat, creating a memorable day filled with joy, learning, and inspiration.

Education - NSW

The SeeMore Safety program continues to have a big impact across the Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, and Hunter Valley regions. In 2025, more than 72 early education services received engaging safety education sessions.

A highlight of the program was the opportunity for children to interact with mini ponies Carm and Eleven Eleven. These character visits brought the narrative to life, helping to reinforce core kindness messages in an interactive, fun, and memorable way.

A generous donation from Lake Macquarie City Council enabled the KIDS Foundation to take part in this year's "You're Kidding Me" expo. The event welcomed 123 adults and 101 children and proved to be a valuable platform for community engagement.

We are proud to see the continued expansion and recognition of the SeeMore programs and are grateful to our community partners for their ongoing support in helping us make a lasting difference in children's lives.

THE GRANT FAMILY

Back in 2010 the Grant Family came into the KIDS Foundation world through the Irvine Club fundraising lunch. The not-for-profit club generates funds for local charities. Matt Thiele, KIDS Foundation Youth Ambassador, was invited to be the guest speaker at just 13 years old. Now when you read the line-up of speakers that had previously spoken, Sam Newman, Rex Hunt, Sir Ian Botham, Sir Vivian Richards, Sir Richard Hadlee, Dermott Brereton, Billy Brownless, Robbie Slater, Allan Border, Kevin Sheedy, Sam Kekovich, Steve Bradbury and Tim Watson, just to name a few, this was a huge honour. Seated amongst the crowd was Justin and Paul Grant, who, at the time, were Directors of the family owned business Consolidated Property Services.

A couple of years down the track we received a call from Director of Consolidated, Eliza Hoppe, making some enquiries about the KIDS Foundation as they were looking for a new charity to support. That was in 2012, and today they are still one of the KIDS Foundation's most 'Trusted, Loyal and Kind' partners. Even after selling their business, the family continues to support the Foundation in many ways, especially Mary and John Grant - Founders of BIC Consolidated and the newly formed Maula Foundation.

They continue to make generous donations, mentor children, attend camps as volunteers and more, but the most treasured support is what John and Mary have done to help us create Tour d'Horse. John is an acclaimed polo player and has ridden in the first two, Tour d'Horse events at the young age of 70, along with his mate and internationally acclaimed Film Director Simon Wincer. Their team is named 'Team Thiele' inspired by the courageous young man Matt Thiele.



MATT THIELE

Matt Thiele was just three when he was trapped in a burning car as his horrified mother watched, back in April 1999. Matt has the cheekiest smile that couldn't be taken away, even on the day that was to change their lives forever. Doctors suggested to Matt's parents that they turn off his life support. They didn't.

"I was three at the time of the car fire but have no memory of it. The doctors had basically given up on me, they didn't think I would make it. They told my parents that if I got through and survived this, my quality of life would not be good. They even suggested to my Mum and Dad, they turn the life support off. Obviously, they didn't because I'm here. Thank goodness for that.

My life up until about 11 was pretty much going to places I felt safe like church and school, and avoiding going anywhere I didn't have to. When I went to the shopping centre it was like I was on show, people would crowd around me and stare. But then I found the KIDS Foundation and my life changed".

Matt started his first business at the age of 20. Starting with 1 vending machine growing to 11, he sold them in 2024 to start a new venture, Candle-Making. He loves that his candles create a warm, inviting atmosphere for others, whilst providing a soothing escape for himself. 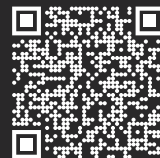
